

Troop 139 Service Hours Guidelines

All scouts are expected to engage in service to the community. This service ideally should occur as part of a Troop or Patrol project. However, individual service projects can be counted in some situations, with the prior approval of the Scoutmaster or Committee Chair. These projects must meet the following guidelines:

- a) service to a school or church (not associated with fundraising),
- b) working with others to accomplish a goal, and
- c) service hours outside the troop are necessary for the rank advancement and troop/patrol service projects are not available.

The service should be of appreciable length (at least 1 hour), and be for the betterment of the organization.

Examples include working as a guide at parent-teacher conferences, helping in church cleanup, distributing food for meals-on-wheels, etc. Examples that would not count are things like working at the snack-bar or gate during a football game, being team manager, collecting signatures on petitions, and so forth.
